

# Travel Guide: 10 Popular Places to Visit in Verona

## 1. Verona Arena

Verona Arena is a very old Roman stadium built almost 2,000 years ago. It is one of the best-preserved Roman amphitheatres in the world. Today, people still use it for concerts and opera shows. In summer, thousands of people sit inside to watch music performances.

Why visit?

- It shows what buildings looked like in Roman times.
- You can watch concerts and operas there.

## 2. Juliet's House (Casa di Giulietta)

### 4. Castelvecchio

Castelvecchio is a large medieval castle built in the 1300s. It was used to protect the city. Today it is a museum with paintings, weapons, and statues.

### 5. Ponte Pietra
