

Uniform Policy 2025



This policy has been written after collaboration with parents, staff and governors.

We believe in having **high expectations** of presentation in our school, where our children are smartly dressed. We believe dressing smartly in a school uniform supports the ethos of our school and assists with good behaviour and fostering a strong feeling of belonging amongst the children. It is embedded within our school Mission Statement that, **“Together, with Gods help we can aspire, believe and achieve.”**

Our school colours are royal blue, yellow (gold) and grey.

Uniform attire

- White shirt & school tie
- Tartan skirt or grey pinafore
- Grey trousers (Not Black)
- School “logo” gold rimmed royal blue V-neck jumper or
- Gold rimmed royal blue cardigan
- White or grey socks
- Grey tights
- Black school shoes
- Blue and white checked dress for summer

PE KIT

- Yellow polo shirt
- Royal blue shorts
- Black pumps
- (Velcro fastenings are easier for the children)

Please put your child's name on every item of clothing and provide a named bag.

It is of great assistance to your child's teacher to be able to identify clothing easily and quickly, and so prevent the child from becoming upset.

When children come to school in wellingtons (in rain or snow), it also helps if they have a clothes peg with their name on, to clip the wellingtons together.

Children must then change into their normal shoes in school. We attempt to allow the children to play outside during all breaks and it is therefore advisable to send them to school well wrapped up against the elements during the winter months and protected from the sun in the summer term.

Outdoor Games

For outdoor games and activities, the children will need extra PE Kit (see above) such as a sweatshirt or tracksuit to keep warm at the start of the lesson.

Trainers are far more suitable for work outdoors in the wet.

Football boots must be worn on the playing field.

It is also a good idea in the winter months to bring a towel as children can often get extremely wet and muddy.

Jewellery

Items of jewellery can cause accidents, a great deal of pain to a child and frustration for the teacher. We therefore only allow stud earrings and watches to be worn in school. No other jewellery is permitted i.e.: (Rings, chains or bracelets).

Jewellery in Physical Education Lessons

No jewellery is allowed during any kind of physical education activity.

Any type of earrings (including studs) should not be worn on days when there is swimming, games or P.E. unless the child can remove and replace their own.

Before having your child's ears pierced please consider the problems this may cause in school and whether it is absolutely essential.

Watches may be worn, but each child must remember that he/she is responsible for their own belongings.

Hair Styles and fashion

We expect all children to have a **tidy** appearance in school.

It is important that pupils with long hair have it neatly tied back using **black, blue, grey or white** bobbles / bands in keeping with the school colours. Fashion bobbles are not permitted.

Designs or fashion haircuts (e.g.: shaved heads, Mohican styles, extremely short hairstyles or zigzags, markings, shaved etc.) are not permitted in school. Ultimately the Headteacher will decide if a hairstyle is unacceptable, since parents may have a different view.

Children who do attend school with these styles of hair will be asked to be collected by their parent/carer so that they can be styled in accordance within this policy.

- Tattoos or nail varnish are not permitted.
- Fashion bracelets and loop bracelets are not permitted.
- Makeup is not permitted to be worn or brought in to school.

Footwear

Trainers or plimsolls are not to be worn for school (Unless it is in a PE lesson)

School Bags

School rucksacks, school bags are permitted to bring items needed for school lessons only. **Designer bags must not be brought to school.**

Lost Property

Most lost property is kept in a box in the cloakrooms. Parents are welcome to browse for any lost property after asking at the office.

Monitoring

Pupils' uniform will be monitored from time to time to ensure that pupils are dressed smartly.

Should pupils not be dressed smartly or in accordance with this policy, parents will be informed and a meeting with the Headteacher arranged if presentation does not improve.

If staff believe there to be unpermitted items in children's coats or bags, then school reserves the right to check these items. Two members of staff will be present.
