EYFS —Asia

We have continued reading our new core text 'What the Ladybird Heard at the Seaside':



The children have enjoyed learning the meanings of new vocabulary: **gnash, shriek, deep, pair and damp**. We have made up actions to help us remember the meanings of these words.

The children have been learning to sew this week, in preparation of us making fish cushions over the last two weeks. The children have learnt to thread a needle and do the running stitch.

In maths the children have been learning about money. The children have been identify the coins: 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p. They were then practising making different amounts to buy items from our class shop. The children do really well with this and some began making their own items to sell with price tags.



We continued to read the story 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' to begin our line of enquiry on ocean pollution. The children worked together to make a large ocean collage which was presented in assembly. They added plastic waste to the collage and spoke about the injustice of plastic in the oceans.
