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EYFS—Asia

EYFS Newsletter – 28th April

Welcome back for our last term in Reception Class.

As the weather has improved it is very important that you send your child to school wearing suncream, with a hat and water bottle. You need to apply the suncream before you child comes to school.



In literacy this week, we created interest in our new text by going on a minibeast hunt. The children found minibeasts (toys) all around the classroom and found real minibeasts in the bug hotel in our outdoor area. We used our phonics to write simple sentences to describe a caterpillar ready to launch our new text.

In maths, we have been counting on starting at a number between 1 and 5. We have been learning that we don't always need to count from 1 when we already know how many we started with. For example, I have 5 cubes in my basket. I am going to add 3 more. How many do I have altogether? 5.....6,7,8. I have 8 cubes altogether.

We have started learning about minibeasts and have been naming and describing minibeasts we know. We have looked at their habitats and sorted them into where they are most likely to live.



We have looked at 'Snail' by the artist, Matisse this week, and the children have created their own snail art in his style.

In RE, we have started the unit: Special Places. We talked about what places are special to us and what makes them special.

The children in Year 1 have had a super start to the new term and settled back into working hard in lessons. We had our class photograph taken on Thursday, this will be sent home soon for you to see. Year 1 School Trip

We will be going on our school trip on Thursday, 19th June. I have booked for the class to go to Smithills Open Farm, Bolton. I took my class last year, it was a wonderful day with lots of great experiences. Further details will be sent out soon.

Reading Books

I have made a change with the reading books. Please can your child just bring in their reading book when they have finished reading it. Please sign it to say it has been read and then we know to change it. Thank you!

Maths-we have started our division work and the children have been rewarded again by knowing their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

English-we have been punctuating instructions with capital letters and full stops. We have been learning about imperative verbs and using them in sentences. We have extended instructions with the conjunction "so" and made a booklet out of them.

Design Technology-the children have started their research for making a vegetable salad. We have learnt the names of various vegetables and the part of the plant that we are eating e.g.: stem, flower, leaf, fruit or root.

Science- in our science lessons we have been learning about the 5 groups that we classify all animals- mammals, fish, birds, reptiles and amphibians. We grouped different animals and learnt the definition of each.

Wednesday- red and yellow book homework due in. Even if the children haven't completed an tasks, please hand-in, in the plastic folder.

Friday-Spelling and Table Tests- test and results are in the yellow book. Some super test scores.

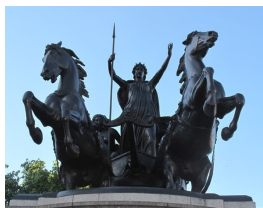
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Year 3 — Europe
